

Response when warnings are issued

< Eligible Alerts>

- Special storm (snow) warning
- Special heavy snow warning
- Level 5 Heavy Rain Special Warning
- Level 4 heavy rain hazard warning
- Level 3 heavy rain warning
- Storm (snow) warning

[If announced before the start of the session (by 7:00 AM)]

◇ If the above alert has been issued as of 7:00 AM

Classes on the day will be canceled.

* Previously, if the alert was lifted at 11:00 AM, students would attend school in the afternoon, but this has been changed to this standard.

◇ If the above alert is lifted by 7:00 AM

After confirming the safety of the school route, classes will proceed as usual.

However, if there are obstacles to attending school, such as flooding roads, rising rivers, bridge collapses, or landslides, the Hiratano Junior High School District will discuss and take appropriate measures such as changing the start time or canceling attendance on the day.

[If announced after the start of work (after 7:00 AM)]

◇ Based on weather conditions, school routes, and road conditions, the Hiratano Junior High School District will discuss and take the following measures.

(1) If it is difficult to send students home safely, appropriate measures will be taken, such as having students wait at school and maintaining close contact with parents until a safe way to leave school is secured.

(2) If a safe way to leave school is confirmed, the student must leave under the supervision or supervision of faculty or staff.

(3) For emergency dismissal, ask a guardian to pick up or pick up the child using Tetoru.

* Decisions and responses will be made while also following instructions from the Suzuka City Board of Education.

[Other]

◇ If you think it is dangerous to attend school due to heavy rain or other reasons, please wait at home until safety is confirmed.

◇ Since September 2026, heavy rain warnings have also been issued when the typhoon does not approach the area.
